The committee reviewed and approved the 2017-18 School Improvement Plan as well as the 2017-18 Land Trust Plan. The vote was unanimous in the affirmative. The details of the School Improvement Plan and the accompanying Land Trust Budget are as follows:

Academic Goal:

SMART Performance Goal: 70% of students will demonstrate proficiency on Union’s common assessments. (Scoring 70% or above on a common assessment will be considered proficient).

Only 6 teachers will need to be hired for the 2017-18 school year, as opposed to 20+ from this past year.

What system structures/routines/procedures will need to be added, altered or omitted?

We will continue to build teacher capacity by:

- *Providing strategic, differentiated professional development.
- *Develop a teacher peer mentoring system
- *To encourage public practice, incorporate targeted learning walks
- *Building Leadership Focus: Strengthen the IPLCs

School Culture Goal:

Problem Statement: On the 2016-17 parent surveys, parents scored Union Middle School a 3.21 out of 4 on the question, "I am pleased with how this school supports my child's emotional well-being." Following a tragic event at our school this year, we want to build a feeling of family and school spirit that will provide an emotionally safe environment for our students.

SMART Performance Goal: 85% of students will report feeling connected to school on targeted school climate survey questions.

- *Building school culture through grade level teams: Building culture through t-shirts & friendly competition across grade levels.
- *Increasing students feeling of connectedness and comfort.
- *Four times a year, grade level teams will do a student culture building activity.
- *Teachers will strategically design structures and activities to increase students' feeling of connectedness and to build their team cultures.
- *We will use social media to post pictures of team activities. This will also be a vehicle to build school culture. In addition, we will share student survey results with the School Community Council.
